Juniors have been really busy 'visiting' restaurants and the Doctor's Surgery for Aistear, going on Spring Walks and using their senses to spot signs of Spring!






For World Book Day they listened to "You Can't Scare a Princess" and then designed their own book covers.



Well done to Aoibhe, Jenny, Tiernan and Michael who have played two very successful group matches in the Munster Schools Tennis Championships.
















Soccer News
